A Modernized Waiting Area for the Mental Health & Addictions Specific Care Clinic

Thanks to donors, the Mental Health & Addictions Specific Care Clinic at the IWK now has a bright waiting area with updated furnishings, beautiful artwork, and enhanced privacy and confidentiality. This calming space has been intentionally co-designed with families, physicians and staff to convey a message of hope, positivity and healing.



The new Admitting and Registration Area for Women's Health serves women and gender-diverse individuals receiving breast and gynecological care related to bladder health, breast health, pelvic floor health, endometriosis and more. These renovations were made possible by you!

Urgently Needed Anesthesia Machines

Thanks to you, our community of donors, vital pieces of specialized equipment were purchased for the IWK in 2024. Most recently, we issued a call to help purchase four new anesthesia machines. These machines will be used in operating rooms and ensure IWK patients needing surgery can be safely put to sleep while their vitals, such as heart rate and blood pressure, are carefully monitored.

Coming Soon: A Brand New IWK Emergency Department

A new IWK Emergency Department (ED) for Maritime children, youth and families will soon be a reality—thanks to donors like you. Triple in size, this new department will help the IWK meet the increased demands of the growing Maritime population and will transform pediatric emergency care in our region.

The new design will ensure less time spent in a crowded waiting area; a feeling that you are moving forward instead of standing still, waiting to be seen. These changes offer a more efficient approach to emergency care resulting in a quicker diagnosis and treatment. Key features of the new ED include a private Emergency Mental Health and Addictions Space and a zone to streamline care for patients presenting with less severe conditions.

Patients and families are playing a key role in this project. Hearing from them directly is essential to help create a calmer, more comfortable environment that inspires hope and distracts from fear.

We're continuing to invest in research opportunities at the IWK that can have an impact locally, nationally and worldwide.

Impacting the Future of Youth Mental Health & Addictions Care

While one in four Canadian youth are affected by mental health or substance use challenges, less than 25 per cent are receiving the mental health support they need. Children and youth are falling through the cracks. Now is the time to make real change.

The creation of an **Ecosystem for Child & Adolescent Mental Health and Addictions** will help create this change. According to available information, this Ecosystem will be the first of its kind in the world. It will bring mental health and addictions services together, ensuring the IWK will be there to help children, youth and families navigate the care they need, when and where they need it.

This Ecosystem includes the IWK's Garron Centre for Child & Adolescent Mental Health (acute inpatient care), the Emergency Mental Health and Addictions Space in the new IWK Emergency Department, Integrated Youth Services-NS (IYS-NS), and a reimagined therapeutic environment for IWK Mental Health and Addictions Intensive Services.

Integrated Youth Services-NS (IYS-NS)

The IWK Foundation is committed to working with our donors to support the creation of eight IYS sites in communities across Nova Scotia. They will provide easy access to the care and services youth aged 12 to 25 need for their mental health and well-being, close to home.

Intensive Services

In the fall of 2024, Myron and Berna Garron announced a catalyst \$25 million donation to support a reimagined environment for Intensive Services—a Mental Health & Addictions program for children and youth who do not need inpatient care but may require services beyond what can be offered in an outpatient clinic. These services are currently fragmented and can be difficult to access. Donors joining the Garrons will help create a new environment for Intensive Services in the community matching the exceptional care provided by IWK teams.



With your support, we will make the Ecosystem for Child & Adolescent Mental Health and Addictions a reality. Together, we will impact the future of mental health and addictions care for generations of children and youth.

Your Community, Your IWK

IWK Health is much more than a building on University Avenue in Halifax, NS. It is an essential part of our Maritime community. Across the region, IWK teams engage and collaborate with care teams in their communities to help ensure patients and families have access to specialized care and enhanced education close to home.

Every patient deserves the same level of care, regardless of where they live. That's why the IWK is expanding its reach in the community by developing a **Pediatric Learning Health System** (**Peds-LHS**)—an innovative program supported by donors to improve access to specialized care for Maritime children, youth and families. The Peds-LHS team will work with health leaders, local care providers, researchers, community partners, and patient and family advisors to address challenges and gaps in pediatric healthcare in your community.

Building on the success of TREKK

Peds-LHS will leverage a national project called Translating Emergency Care for Kids (TREKK). This is one of the many examples of how the IWK expands its walls across the Maritimes. This project ensures that children being cared for in rural and non-pediatric emergency departments have access to the same care as they would at the IWK. Many pediatric conditions are time-sensitive, and every health care provider needs the resources to provide appropriate care to children and youth.

Through donor generosity, the IWK has developed educational videos and modules for TREKK. The IWK has also delivered training to hospitals across Nova Scotia using TREKK resources. In the fall of 2024, the team held education sessions for teams in emergency departments throughout Cape Breton and Western Nova Scotia. The sessions included simulation learning and lectures on diagnosing and treating Meningitis in children and youth.

With the support of donors, the IWK will build on the success of TREKK to implement Peds-LHS. This new program will ensure children and families have access to the best resources and care when they need it most, from emergency care and pain management to mental health and addictions support.



A Proud Moment for the Future of Women's Health in the Maritimes

In October 2024, we were thrilled to be welcomed as the newest member of the Women's Health Collective Canada (WHCC), a strategic alliance of leading women's health and hospital foundations from across Canada. Through intentional collaboration, WHCC foundations are bringing resources and fundraising together to address the legacy of inequity in women's health research.
